

Leaflet Patents in Norway

Duration

The duration of the patent is 20 years from the filing date, subject to payment of annual fees.

Compulsory use

If a patent has not been worked in Norway within 3 years from the date of grant and within 4 years from the filing date of the application, a compulsory license may be requested by any person who wants to work the invention in Norway.

Marking

Marking of patented articles is not compulsory. The indication 'NO patent ...' (followed by the patent number) or 'Norsk Patent No. ...' may be used. Anyone who indicates that a patent has been granted (by marking of products or their packaging, in advertisements, or in any other way) without at the same time indicating the number of the patent, must on request of any person furnish said number immediately.

EEA member countries

Norway is a member of the European Economic Area (EEA). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EEA member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EEA member countries basically cannot be prevented. These other EEA member countries presently are Iceland, Liechtenstein and the member countries of the European Union (EU).
