Leaflet Patents in South Africa

Duration

The duration of the patent is 20 years from the date of filing the application, subject to the payment of annual renewal fees.

Compulsory use

A patented invention should be worked in South Africa on a commercial scale or to an adequate extent after expiration of a period of 3 years from the date of sealing of the patent or 4 years from filing the application, whichever period ends last. If a patented invention without legitimate reasons is not so worked, it will become subject to the grant of a compulsory license upon request of an third party.

Marking

Patented articles should be marked 'Patent No.' or 'Patented No.' followed by the number of the patent, with a view to the possibility to claim damages in case of infringement. Indication of the patent number is essential, as otherwise the marking will not be deemed to constitute a notice of the existence of the patent.

License

A license contract should be recorded in the Register in order to be effective as against third parties. We suggest that you contact us if you plan to grant a license under your patent in the Republic of South Africa.
