

## Leaflet European Patent in Denmark

### Territory

The Danish part of the European patent covers the territory of Denmark only and does not extend to the territories of the Faeroe Islands and Greenland.

### National patent number

No national patent number is assigned to the Danish part of the European patent.

### Duration

Provided that the annual national renewal fees are paid, the patent has a duration of 20 years from the European filing date.

### Compulsory use

Patents should be worked in Denmark or within any other EU member country or within another WTO member country within 3 years from the grant of the patent and within 4 years from the application date, whichever term ends later. A compulsory license may be granted to anyone who is able to work the invention in Denmark, provided that the patentee, without acceptable excuse, did not work his invention in Denmark or within any other EU member country or within another WTO member country within this term.

### Marking

Marking is not compulsory, and marked products have no implications for awarding compensation in case of past infringement. If marking is desired it can be done by the usual Danish form "Dansk Patent No. DK/EP" followed by the patent number.

### EU member countries

Denmark is a member of the European Union (EU). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EU member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EU member countries basically cannot be prevented.
