

Leaflet European Patent in Estonia

National patent number

No national patent number is assigned to the Estonian part of the European patent.

Duration

Provided that the annual national renewal fees are paid, the patent has a duration of 20 years from the European filing date.

Compulsory use

Within 3 years from the date of publication of the grant of the European Patent or 4 years from the filing date of the European Patent (whichever ends last), a patented invention should be sufficiently worked or a patented product should be imported from any state member of the WTO, so as to satisfy the needs of the domestic market. If there is no such working or importation, any person may apply for a compulsory license.

Marking

Marking is not compulsory, and marked products have no implications for awarding compensation in case of past infringement.

EU member countries

Estonia is a member of the European Union (EU). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EU member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EU member countries basically cannot be prevented.
