

Leaflet European Patent in Finland

National patent number

No national patent number is assigned to the Finnish part of the European patent.

Duration

Provided that the annual national renewal fees are paid, the patent has a duration of 20 years from the European filing date.

Compulsory use

Working of a patented invention is not compulsory. However, if a patent has not been worked or brought into use to a reasonable extent in Finland within 3 years from grant and within 4 years from the application date, it may become the subject of compulsory licenses upon request of a third party.

Marking

Marking is not compulsory. Anyone who indicates that a patent has been granted or been applied for (by marking of products or their packaging, in advertisements, or in any other way) without at the same time indicating the (serial) number of the patent application or patent concerned must on request furnish said number immediately.

Licenses

Licenses are only effective against third parties if recorded. We recommend that you contact us if you intend to grant a license under the Finnish part your European patent.

EU member countries

Finland is a member of the European Union (EU). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EU member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EU member countries basically cannot be prevented.
