

## Leaflet European Patent in Luxembourg

### National patent number

No national patent number is assigned to the Luxembourg part of the European patent.

### Duration

Provided that the annual national renewal fees are paid, the patent has a duration of 20 years from the European filing date.

### Compulsory use

A patented invention must be worked in the territory of Luxemburg or of any other member country of the World Trade Organization (WTO) in a manner sufficient to satisfy the needs of the Luxemburg market within 3 years from the date of grant or within 4 years from the date of filing the application (if that period expires later), and such working may not be discontinued for more than three years. If this requirement without legitimate reasons is not met the patent will become subject to the grant of compulsory licences upon request of a third party.

### Marking

Marking is not compulsory. Possible marking is "Breveté", or "Patented".

### EU member countries

Luxembourg is a member of the European Union (EU). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EU member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EU member countries basically cannot be prevented.
