# Leaflet European Patent in Norway

### **National patent number**

No national patent number is assigned to the Norwegian part of the European patent.

#### **Duration**

Provided that the annual national renewal fees are paid, the patent has a duration of 20 years from the European filing date.

#### **Compulsory use**

If a patent has not been worked in Norway within 3 years from the date of grant and within 4 years from the filing date of the application, a compulsory license may be requested by any person who wants to work the invention in Norway.

#### **Marking**

Marking of patented articles is not compulsory. The indication 'EP patent ...' (followed by the patent number) or 'European Patent No. ...' may be used. Anyone who indicates that a patent has been granted (by marking of products or their packaging, in advertisements, or in any other way) without at the same time indicating the number of the patent, must on request of any person furnish said number immediately.

#### **EU** member countries

Norway is a member of the European Union (EU). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EU member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EU member countries basically cannot be prevented.
