

## Leaflet European Patent in Portugal

### Territory

The Portuguese part of this European patent covers the territory of Portugal including the Azores and the Madeira Islands.

### National patent number

No national patent number is assigned to the Portuguese part of the European patent.

### Duration

Provided that the annual national renewal fees are paid, the patent has a duration of 20 years from the European filing date.

### Compulsory use

A patented invention must be worked by the owner of the patent or with his authorization, either in Portugal or in any other EU member country in such manner as to satisfy the needs of the national market in Portugal. If a patented invention without legitimate reason is not worked at all or is not worked sufficiently within 3 years from publication of the notice of grant of the patent, or 4 years from filing the application, whichever period ends last, or if the working has been discontinued for 3 years or more without legitimate reason, any interested person may apply for the grant of a compulsory licence.

### Marking

Marking of patent protected products is advisable. Possible marking: "Patente no." (followed by the patent number), or "Pat. no." (followed by the patent number), or "Patenteado".

### EU member countries

Portugal is a member of the European Union (EU). As far as patents are concerned, this has the consequence that once products protected by the patent are sold by or with the permission of the patentee in one EU member country, shipment of these products into and out of other EU member countries basically cannot be prevented.
