

Leaflet Patents in Thailand

Duration

The duration of a patent is 20 years from the filing date, subject to the payment of annual fees.

Compulsory Use

A patent must be sufficiently worked in Thailand within three years from grant or within four years from filing of the application, whichever period is longer. If the patentee, without sufficient legitimate reasons, does not utilize their patented invention within the specified time, anyone may apply for a compulsory license to exploit the invention.

Marking

Possible marking can include the following: 'Thai Patent No ... ,' or any foreign word of the same meaning on the product, the container or package of the product, or in the advertisement of the product. It is essential that, when marking is applied, the number of the patent concerned is mentioned. Marking is not compulsory but recommended to prevent infringers from claiming good faith.

Licenses

A license agreement must be registered with the Thai Patent Office, failure to do so may result in the cancellation of patent. We recommend you to contact us if you intend to grant a license under your patent in Thailand.
